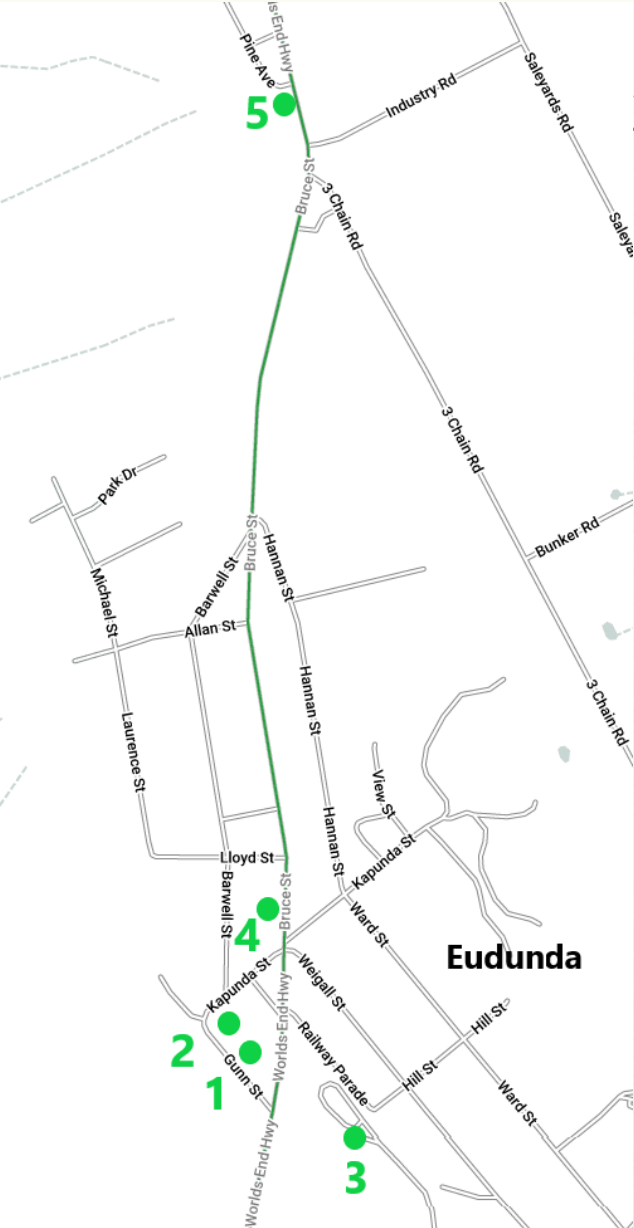




1. Water Feature

From idle talk during the tiling of the water feature in the park bubbled up the idea of a community centre for getting together to socialize, work on crafts etc. A sign was needed, visible from the road and so, one was created by Hub members. It is in the colours of The Hub and features knitting needles and yarns at one end, as though knitting up the letters. At the other side, it has a hammer and nail and a saw. These represent the mix of crafts and interests of The Hub members.

Eudunda MOSAIC TRAIL



The hills around Eudunda are a mosaic of shapes & colours, all fitting neatly together to create our landscape. The people of Eudunda also form a mosaic of different cultures, generations, values & ideas.

It's from this diverse collective that an interest in mosaic was formed.



The very first project, the drinking fountain in the local Gardens, was a community project for SALA in 2016. No-one had done mosaic previously but for some, it was just the start of the passion. Mosaics thrive here.

Now, we have a small but happily committed group of tilers within the community and the volume of their work is growing into an outstanding portfolio of colour, texture and interest in the town.

1. The water feature consists of small diamond-shaped panels, each depicting the tiler's concept of life in Eudunda. This was created for SALA 2015, with the theme of 'blue'. Each of the panels were tiled in our local Hall and then, brought here to the park, glued to the base and then grouted. Students from the schools were involved and this created a precedence for all our community mosaic.



2. In 2020, The Eudunda Hub & Shed set up a program as a donation to the town to celebrate 150 years of European settlement. The community chose to create a chaise longue in the local Gardens as a feature to compliment the drinking fountain



The base was built by a local craftsman from local stone and the tiled shapes had to include some historical depiction of life in Eudunda. About 60 people attended the workshops at The Hub and an amazing lot of shapes were tiled with so many different subjects.

The shapes were then stuck onto the chaise to create this unique and outstanding example of community enterprise. There was such enthusiasm for the tiling of the chaise in the Park that too many shapes were tiled!

3. It was decided that they would be on display in the precinct of the newly-painted silos to complement that area and to extend the line of town mosaic. Since these panels are also close to the railway station, you can see connections to it amongst the shapes.
